211

Dialing “211” provides individuals and families in need with a shortcut to health and human service agencies. By simply dialing 211, those in need of assistance are referred, and sometimes connected, to appropriate agencies and community organizations.

Referrals include:

- **Basic Human Needs Resources** – including food and clothing banks, shelters, rent and utility assistance.
- **Physical and Mental Health Resources** – including health insurance programs, medical information lines, crisis intervention services, support groups, counseling, and drug and alcohol intervention and rehabilitation.

- **Work Support** – including financial assistance, job training, transportation assistance and education programs.
- **Support for Older Americans and Persons with Disabilities** – including adult day care, community meals, respite care, home health care, transportation and homemaker services.
- **Children, Youth, and Family Support** – including childcare, after school programs, educational programs for low-income families, family resource centers, summer camps and recreation programs, mentoring, tutoring and protective services.

Those who apply for food stamps must have or apply for a Social Security number and be either a U.S. citizen, U.S. national or have status as a qualified alien.

When you are interviewed, you also should have:

- Identification such as a driver's license, state ID, birth certificate or alien card
- Proof of income such as pay stubs, Social Security, SSI or a pension for each member of your household
- Proof of how much you spend for childcare
- Rent receipts or proof of your mortgage payments

- Records of your utility costs; and medical bills for those age 60 or older, and for those who receive government payments such as Social Security or SSI.

Surrendering to God and accepting Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior is what brings salvation into our lives. Salvation cannot be earned. Salvation is by grace, through faith in Christ (Ephesians 2:8).

The following verses, found in the book of Romans, help us see God’s truth about salvation.

Romans 3:23 — “For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God.”

Romans 6:23 — “For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.”

Romans 5:5 — “...but God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.”

Romans 10:9–10 — “If you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. For it is by believing in your heart that you are made right with God, and it is by confessing with your mouth that you are saved.”

Romans 10:13 — “Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.”

Romans 5:1 — “Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ.”

Romans 8:1 — “Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus.”

Romans 8:38-39 — “For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.”
