## The Parable of the Sower

**13** That same day Jesus went out of the house and sat by the lake. <sup>2</sup> Such large crowds gathered around him that he got into a boat and sat in it, while all the people stood on the shore. <sup>3</sup> Then he told them many things in parables, saying: "A farmer went out to sow his seed. <sup>4</sup> As he was scattering the seed, some fell along the path, and the birds came and ate it up.<sup>5</sup> Some fell on <u>rocky places</u>, where it did not have much soil. It sprang up quickly, because the soil was shallow. <sup>6</sup> But when the sun came up, the plants were scorched, and they withered because they had no root. <sup>7</sup> Other seed fell among <u>thorns</u>, which grew up and choked the plants. <sup>8</sup> Still other seed fell on good soil, where it produced a crop—a hundred, sixty or thirty times what was sown. <sup>9</sup> Whoever has ears, let them hear." <sup>10</sup> The disciples came to him and asked, "Why do you speak to the people in parables?" **Matthew 13:1-10** 

FARMER/SOWER = <mark>JESUS</mark>

SEED = THE WORD OF GOD

THE FIELD = THE WORLD

THE SOIL = CONDITION OF THE HEART

BIRDS = <mark>SATAN</mark>

# PROTECT THE SOIL (OUR HEART)

<sup>45</sup> The good man out of the good treasure of his heart brings forth what is good; and the evil *man* out of the evil *treasure* brings forth what is evil; for his mouth speaks from that which fills his heart. **Luke 6:45-46** 

# PROTECT FROM A HARDENED HEART

<sup>7</sup> Therefore, just as the Holy Spirit says, "Today if you hear His voice, <sup>8</sup> Do not harden your hearts as when they provoked Me, as in the day of trial in the wilderness, **Heb. 3:7-8** 

<sup>2</sup> For indeed we have had good news preached to us, just as they also; but the word they heard did not profit them, because Dit was not united by faith in those who heard. **Heb. 4:2**

### AMONG THE THORNS (V.7)

**THE WORLD** (1 John 2: 15-17) "Do not love the world or anything in the world."

IDENTIFIED BY IT'S FRUIT

## HOW DO I CULTIVATE "THE GOOD SOIL"

#### FORGE A RESILIENT HEART

<sup>20</sup> My child, pay attention to what I say. Listen carefully to my words. <sup>21</sup> Don't lose sight of them. Let them penetrate deep into your heart, <sup>22</sup> for they bring life to those who find them, and healing to their whole body.
<sup>23</sup> Guard your heart above all else, for it determines the course of your life. Proverbs 4:20-23

#### PLANT DEEP ROOTS

<sup>6</sup> And now, just as you accepted Christ Jesus as your Lord, you must continue to follow him. <sup>7</sup> Let your roots grow down into him, and let your lives be built on him. Then your faith will grow strong in the truth you were taught, and you will overflow with thankfulness. **Col. 2:7** 

<sup>1</sup>Oh, the joys of those who do not follow the advice of the wicked, or stand around with sinners, or join in with mockers. <sup>2</sup>But they delight in the law of the Lord, meditating on it day and night. <sup>3</sup>They are like trees planted along the riverbank, bearing fruit each season. Their leaves never wither, and they prosper in all they do. **Ps. 1:1-3** 

## ACCEPT RESPONSIBILITY

<sup>29</sup> The Holy Spirit said to Philip, "Go over and walk along beside the carriage." <sup>30</sup> Philip ran over and heard the man reading from the prophet Isaiah.
